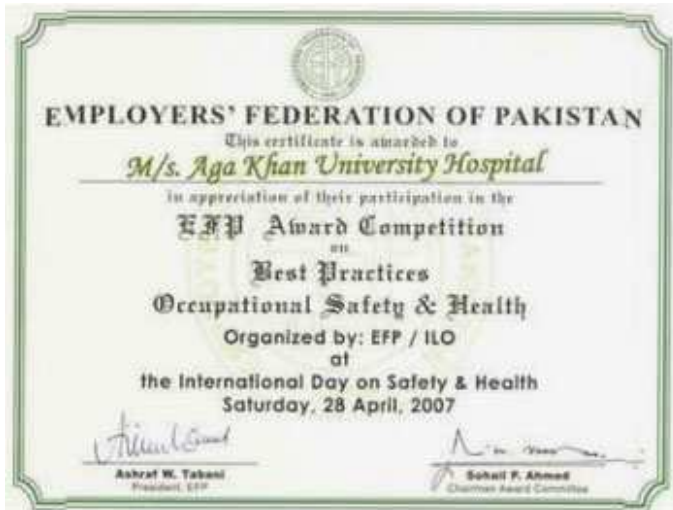


AKUH Wins Award for Best Practices on Occupational Safety and Health May 22, 2007
